

Good morning!

We wanted to take a moment this morning to remind the body that we are still under the Governor's guidelines for houses of worship.

**We are requesting that out of respect and giving preference to one another in honor (Rom 12) we follow the guidelines below. Our guidelines, as of today are...**

- Per the Governor's order #63 of 8/11/20, as we may have 100+ people gather, attendees must wear face coverings while entering and exiting the gathering and while moving to and from their seats. Once seated with your family/party, you are free to remove your face covering.
- There will continue to be two services at 9 & 11am, with enough time between services to sanitize and clean. Please help us in this effort by exiting the building when the first service is finished.
- To accommodate as many people that wish to come, if you are not serving or part of the ministry team on Sunday, please attend ONE service. Additionally, please be mindful of promptness and respect service start times, and refrain from coming to "Service 1B", aka the "Third Service" from 10-12.
- Please refrain from entering the building until first service has concluded. Ushers will be at the foyer doors to let you know when you may enter for 2<sup>nd</sup> service at 11am.
- The sanctuary will be arranged in family seating clusters to maintain 6' social distancing. When the sanctuary has reached capacity, you may be directed by an Usher to the overflow area in the Fellowship Hall, where you can participate through a live video feed. Please note that attendees who are not part of the same immediate household/party must be seated at least 6 feet apart.
- There will continue to be no childcare, nursery, or children's church. Children's church will continue to be broadcast weekly by our amazing Kids' Church team.
- You are free to socialize and catch up outside the building, but please refrain from congregating in the foyer or halls.
- Because we are maintaining a one-way traffic flow, people are asked to enter through the foyer, and exit the building by either the Sanctuary emergency door or the Bingo Hall. Entrance and exits will have signage.
- There will be hand sanitizer available at the foyer entrance, the Info Center, and at the building exits.
- Baskets for offering will be placed on the altar.
- Grab your morning coffee before church, as the Cafe' will not be open.

- As not everyone is comfortable with physical contact, please respect others' space. The Governor's guidelines discourage close physical contact with other attendees, staff, including handshakes, embraces, and kissing.
- If you have any questions or concerns Sunday morning, please speak with an Usher, Deacon or Elder.
- From the Governor's guidelines, we request that if you are experiencing **any** COVID-19 symptoms, please do NOT come to church. Symptoms and risks include:
  1. Fever (feeling feverish or a document temperature of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher)
  2. Respiratory symptoms such as runny nose, nasal congestion, sore throat, cough, or shortness of breath
  3. Whole body symptoms such as muscle aches, chills, and severe fatigue
  4. Changes in the person's sense of taste or smell
  5. Have you been in close contact with someone who is suspected or confirmed to have COVID-19 in the past 14 days? (Note: healthcare workers caring for COVID-19 patients while wearing appropriate personal protective equipment should answer "no" to this question.)
  6. Person has traveled in the past 14 days either:
    - a. Internationally (outside the U.S.)
    - b. By cruise ship; or
    - c. Domestically (within the U.S.) outside of NH, VT, or ME on public transportation (e.g., bus, train, plane, etc.)
- In addition to the Governor's guidelines above, in order to honor, respect and protect higher risk members of Crossing Life Church, if you have had close contact with anyone who has tested COVID-19 positive in the last 14 days, please refrain from attending church in person. As always, if you are sick, according to James 5:14 please "call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord".

If you are not yet comfortable being among a group, please continue to engage with us through our Sunday broadcasts. We are not interested in being COVID police, having to enforce rules, but rather want to see people go deeper with Jesus and spread the Gospel during these unprecedented times!
